Covid news - Term 1 2021

Please note a slight change in the QR Code check-in below (bold italics)

Seacliff's individual QR code is now clearly displayed at all entry point gates and some buildings/doors. Please remember to bring your mobile phone with you to do the check-in. The government's paper recording template (for people who don't have a smart phone) is kept in the front office. All adults, including staff and parents, are expected to COVID SAfe Check-In when entering classrooms/buildings on site. At this stage, it's not necessary to check-in at the school gate to enter school grounds. The COVID SAfe Check-in is purely for SA Health contact tracing purposes and doesn't replace our normal visitor sign-in process. All guests should continue to sign in at the front office/reception on arrival.

Rooms 18 & 19 – Classroom Culture

Establishing a positive classroom culture paves the way for a very successful school year! During the first week of school we collaborated to develop our class contract. It is created around our 6 school values. As a class we unpacked what each value meant so students were able to develop a deeper understanding of each.
