- The school uniform has been designed to be practical, affordable and to look presentable.
- We want students to feel proud about wearing their school uniform and also have the flexibility to be actively involved in their entire learning, whether it is classroom orientated or outdoor/physical education.
- It also assists in the safety of students as they are easily discernible in the yard or on excursions.
- No decorations, embroidery, brand labels, stripes or piping on clothing, excluding footwear.
- The Uniform Shop, located in the Front Office is open each Monday 8:45am to 9:30am, Wednesday 2:45pm to 3:30pm and Friday from 8.45am to 9.30am.
- Uniforms can also be ordered on QKR and delivered to class teachers for distribution.

SUMMER UNIFORM

Plain navy blue shorts, blue & white check dress, navy blue skirt or pants worn with school light blue polo shirt with logo.

Bike pants under skirts are recommended, particularly for physical education. School navy windcheater or double blue jacket with logo, white, black or navy socks are preferred. Skirts, shorts and dresses are to be mid-thigh length or longer.

WINTER UNIFORM

Light blue polo shirt with logo, school navy windcheater or double blue jacket with logo. Navy blue skirt, plain navy long pants or navy track pants (leggings/bike shorts are not permitted unless worn under dress or skirt). White, black or navy socks are preferred.

FOOTWEAR

Students require shoes they can run around in so thongs are not permitted. Flat school sandals are acceptable as are most types of shoes. A shoe should be flat, offer good support and have a flexible sole. Shoes should be supportive enough to enable the child to fully participate in PE lessons.

COSMETICS - Make-up is not to be worn. Nail polish is discouraged and acrylic nails are not permitted.

HAIR - All long hair to be tied back (beyond shoulder length). Hair should be combed or brushed and clipped back to keep out of the student's face if necessary. School colour ties are recommended. Hair ties, bows or ribbons should be kept short in length and small in size.

HATS

Sun Smart navy blue school legionnaire, bucket or wide brimmed hats are enforced for outside wear, except during winter (effectively all of Term 2 and up to and including 31 July). A navy blue beanie may be worn outdoors during winter. Failure to wear a hat results in 'No Hat - Play in the Shade'. Hats, beanies and hoods should not be worn indoors.

SCARVES - If scarves are worn, they are to be blue or white.

JEWELLERY – A watch and earrings (stud or sleepers) only. Necklaces are discouraged but if worn for specific reasons e.g. religious, should be concealed under the uniform. No other jewellery or decoration is to be worn with the uniform.

COMMEMORATIVE HOODIES/ SHIRTS (e.g. SAPSASA, School Musical)

Students can only wear them on the day their achievement is acknowledged at a school assembly.
