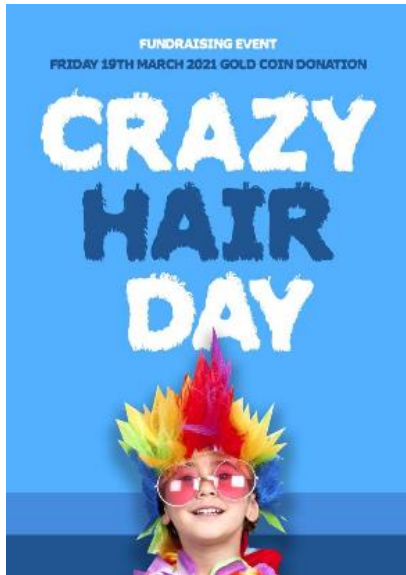




Crazy Hair Day! Friday, 19 March

QKR! App credits

PLEASE REMEMBER TO USE YOUR CREDITS FROM YOUR FAMILY ACCOUNT WHEN PAYING FOR EXCURSION AND CAMPS ETC

QKR is NOT connected to EDSAS (our school system) therefore does not know how much credit you have on your account. Check your statement or contact the Finance Office to find out how much credit you have.

Click on the excursion etc that you would like to pay on QKR.

You will have 3 options:

- Payment in Full
- Use Credit
- After Credit Balance

1. If you have enough credit to pay for the excursion in full (check statement or contact Finance Office), select 'Use Credit' then continue to complete the permission form.
2. If you do not have enough credit to pay the whole amount, select 'Use Credit' then 'After Credit Balance'. Simply deduct your credit amount from the total due and input the amount outstanding.

Please do not hesitate to contact Lynda in the Finance Office if you have any further questions or are not sure of your credit amount.
