National Cross-Country Championships

Jesse P was selected to represent South Australia at the National '12 and Under' Cross Country Championships, travelling with his team to Canberra to compete. His event was over 2km on a purpose-built course that contained challenges like jumping over hay bales. Because it was a hilly course, it was important to get a good start so Jesse intentionally sprinted to near the lead at the start and held his position throughout the event. After completing the 2km run in just over 7 minutes, Jesse finished 23rd nationally and was the second South Australian to cross the line. Room 1 activities - Lava lamps

In Science this term, Room 1 have been looking at how different materials can be changed and/or combined for a particular purpose. This topic has allowed us to take a hands-on approach and we have conducted many fun experiments, including making our own lava lamps.

For this experiment we predicted and observed what happened when mixing oil and water together and then dropped in some food colouring and 'fizzy tablets' to make the chemical reaction. Students enjoyed watching the colourful





bubbles bounce around within their lava lamp.

Half portraits

In Maths we have been looking fractions and the characteristics that help us identify them. To consolidate our learning around halves having to be two equal parts the students in Room 1 created their own half portraits. They first had to find the halfway mark on their pages in order to draw our geometric lines from. Then students enjoyed using mirrors and pictures to help them draw their half portraits. Finally, students were able to paint their work and describe the characteristics of their half portrait.
