Students learned the meaning behind parts of the word *chanoyu*, *cha* meaning tea, *no* meaning's and *yu* meaning hot water. Put together, *chanoyu* refers to 'tea's hot water'. Gilbey Sensei demonstrated immense skill and passion during her teachings of the intricacies of the tea ceremony and she greatly appreciated the respect and interest shown by students on the day. Students were able to make their own macha tea using a traditional tea whisk known as a *chasen*. They also tried a sticky rice cake. The year 6 Japanese leaders assisted on the day and were also lucky enough to participate in the ceremony themselves.

It has been wonderful to hear positive feedback from some families and students about how much they enjoyed the experience. We hope to plan further cultural events and experiences for students at Seacliff in 2024.








A Seacliff star at the Australian Open
