The Australian Early Development Census

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) occurs every three years and will be conducted this term. The AEDC is a nationwide census undertaken to understand early childhood development. The AEDC provides evidence to support policy and planning for children. This involves Reception teachers completing a 'measure' for each of their students after their first term of schooling.

The school was successful with a recent Food Security grant application, receiving \$4000.00. Proposed projects needed to have a focus on students being able to grow, access and prepare food. Our application focused on the development of a **Community Orchard**. This will repurpose the existing frog pond area and we are looking forward to completing this project in conjunction with student, staff and interested community members. Pupil Free Day

Our next Pupil Free Day will occur this coming Friday 17 May. The focus will be on further developing staff knowledge of our identified Area of Impact, Effective Learners. We will clarify our understanding of metacognition and self-regulation as well as revise differentiation in response to staff feedback.

Bike and scooter use

Bike/scooter use before and after school was clarified with all students at the recent assembly. It is very exciting to see significantly more students now riding or scooting to and from school (our new bike and scooter racks are consistently full) however we have had several parents report to us that they have been hit/or nearly hit by students riding within the school yard, or have witnessed students riding or scooting in very unsafe ways. All students have now been reminded that they are unable to ride or scoot in the school yard before school. They are permitted to ride or scoot on the courts area after the 3:30pm bell under the supervision of their parents as long as sports training is not happening at this time.





ANZAC Day

On Thursday 25th of May I laid the wreath for Seacliff Primary School along with Layla and Adele. It was cold, dark and early but wasn't dangerous and we weren't risking our lives like the soldiers did. We picked up our wreath and lined up standing side by side with all the other local schools. We listened thoughtfully as people told stories about their loved ones going to war, what it was like and how they felt. We watched all the other schools walk up and lay their wreath. Finally, it was our turn. Layla, Adele and I walked up holding the Seacliff wreath, placed it carefully next to all the others and walked back. It felt special to lay the wreath for Seacliff.

Governing Council would like to support our students in accessing important

technology now!

Seacliff Primary School has a current 3-year plan to replace existing Promethean Interactive Whiteboards with Clever Touch screens in all our classrooms. Our students know and enjoy the benefits of Clever Touch screens as the majority of our classes have already been upgraded to this new technology. However, four classrooms are not scheduled to be upgraded until 2025. Our Governing Council are proposing the introduction of a fundraising option within Qkr! for any families who are keen to support this change happening earlier. If every family in our school community donated \$40, then all the students would have access to the learning experience this year.

Why?

All classroom students can interact with a Clever Touch screen simultaneously. There are 50 touchpoints, so multiple children can work together on the same screen. This is impossible with the old Promethean Whiteboards where any interaction requires a special pen. They are slow to respond, making them impractical and difficult to use. Usable wireless screen sharing brings more flexibility than HDMI cabling. Old Promethean Whiteboards are fit for purpose however, Clever Touch screens are easy to read, draw and note ... great for everything students need.

How?

<u>Use Qkr! and select Fundraising—Technology upgrade.</u> Any donations will be gratefully received and allocated to the purchase of the remaining screens.

Why us?


All students benefit from this new technology, and with only 4 units left for upgrade, let's make it happen! If we do, then almost 100 more of our students could see the difference Clever Touch brings to their learning.

Overall cost

Our fundraising target is **\$14,000** to replace the remaining 4 Promethean Interactive Whiteboards.

Should we exceed our fundraising target, additional funds will be utilised to purchase additional Phonak Sound Field units for teaching spaces. Students currently experience excellent benefits through the use of these units in multiple classrooms allowing all students to hear better irrespective of where they sit in their classroom.

2024 SRC


