#### Room 18 and 19 - Science

During Science we have been investigating heat and heat transfer. Students worked together in groups to design and build a solar oven. Each group was given the choice of materials that had previously been tested in the sun and needed to select the best ones to create their solar oven. All groups used a pizza box for the base, alfoil to reflect the sunlight into the oven, black paper to

attract the heat, cling wrap to act as a window for the sun to shine through and many other creative ideas. All groups tested their solar ovens to melt butter, chocolate and a marshmallow. Each group design was successful and melted each item.


